International Men's Chorus Presents Festival Concert at Glenn Memorial Auditorium at Emory University

(Portland, Ore.) – A once-in-a-lifetime International Men's Chorus Festival, anchored by the Oregon Adventist Men's Chorus and the Corul Barbatesc Adventist din Romania (Adventist Men's Chorus of Romania), with ensembles from the U.S. and individual singers from around the world, will be held on Saturday, June 26, at 3 p.m., at Glenn Memorial Auditorium on the campus of Emory University, 1660 N. Decatur Rd NE, Atlanta, Ga. The chorus will be accompanied by organ, piano, festival brass and percussion.

Admission to the festival concert is free and a freewill offering will be collected to help defray expenses.

The concert represents the final performance of the combined choruses from the U.S. and Romania, which performs in a Northwest concert tour before traveling to Atlanta to sing for the Seventh-day Adventist Church General Conference quinquennial world meeting.

One of the OAMC's goals for inviting others to join them is to demonstrate the power of God working through men to change lives and to spark a desire to form men's music ministries in other parts of the world.

The Northwest and Atlanta concerts are a reunion of the American and Romanian choruses for what they are calling the "Walk of Faith – Mission to America." The "Walk of Faith" points to the journey members of the men's chorus have experienced as they have followed where God has led the two choruses in ministry. "Mission to America" speaks to the fact that the combined international chorus will be traveling in the Northwest and then to the eastern U.S.

It was just a year ago in April 2009 that some 100 singers from the OAMC traveled to Romania for two weeks where they joined with the Romanian chorus to share the Gospel of Jesus Christ in some of Romania's most renowned concert halls, accompanied by some of the country's best symphony orchestra musicians. Each of the performance venues – whether concert hall, opera house or house of worship – was filled to capacity for every performance. On the final day in Bucharest, an additional concert was scheduled to accommodate the demand for seating.

The April 2009 joining of the two choruses in Romania was the result of a series of providential events. In the late nineties, Vancouver pastor John Wesslen traveled to Romania to speak in a series of evangelistic meetings. There, a young Romanian, who planned to attend the seminary to study to become a pastor, learned that it was possible to study both theology and music in America, something that was not available to him in Romania.

The young man, Alin Apostol, came to study at then Walla Walla College in Eastern Washington. On the soccer field he was invited to travel to Portland to rehearse with a men's choir. During his four years singing with OAMC, he secretly nurtured a dream for a similar men's chorus in Romania, a country with a rich choral tradition. His dream came to fruition in 2007 when he took up the cause and started the Adventist Men's Chorus of Romania.

In addition, when the OAMC traveled in 2000 to the Seventh-day Adventist world church meetings in Toronto, Canada, more than once people from Romania at the meetings urged OAMC members to "come to Romania" to share the music. Those incidents culminated in some 100 American singers, family members and musicians embarking on the April 2009 tour.

Now in its 17th year of ministry, OAMC is a group of Christian men who join in worship, praise and public sharing of their faith through music. Formed in 1994, the Oregon Adventist Men's Chorus, under the direction of Lou Wildman, performs anthems, selections from the master composers, traditional hymns and spirituals. Every year, between 100 and 200 men sing in the annual festival chorus held in the Portland-Vancouver area.
